

The Aukana Trust Child Protection Policy

Approved by the Trustees January 2022

The Aukana Trust is a registered charity (No. 326938) based at The House of Inner Tranquillity, a Buddhist Meditation Centre (the "Centre") at 9 Masons Lane, Bradford on Avon, Wiltshire BA15 1QN.

The Centre has no members under the age of 18 years old in its community.

None of the Centre's activities are available to or aimed at children. All contact with children is set out below.

Children and the Meditation Centre

- 1) Approximately every 2 years the Centre may respond to a request for a short educational visit by a small group of "A" Level students. A prerequisite of any such visit is that the children are always accompanied by an adult member of their teaching staff. They remain supervised in their group for the duration of the visit.
- 2) Every two years the Centre hosts an Open Day. This is an afternoon when the family and friends of members are invited to visit the Centre. Children may be present but attend only as part of a family group or with an accompanying adult.

Our responsibility

The Centre's circumscribed contact with children does not diminish the Trust's responsibility to have a policy and practice in place to address safeguarding issues – or potential issues – that may be brought to the attention of Trustees or members in the Centre and/or Trust.

The Trust and Centre acknowledge that anyone can divulge concerns about abuse, or abuse itself, at any point. We understand our responsibility and recognise that we have a duty of care to protect those aged under 18 at all times.

All Trustees and those involved in teaching activities undertake to read this Policy.

In the event of a potential or actual safeguarding concern, Trustees have a duty to follow the formal process set out here and to take appropriate action swiftly and respectfully.
